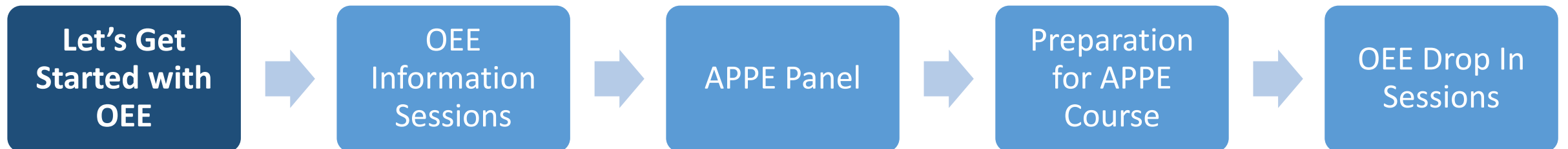
Let's Get Started with OEE

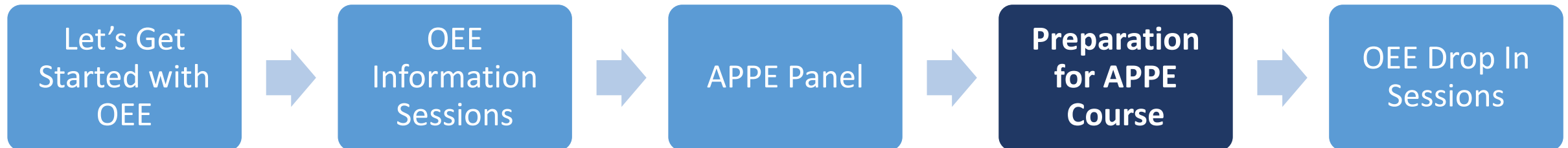


Preparation for APPE Course
